National Apprenticeship Service

Overview

Retail is a dynamic and evolving career choice, three million people are employed across the UK with this sector creating more jobs than any other sector over the last five years.¹

The number of people employed in the UK retail workforce is forecast to increase by 6% over a ten year period (between 2007 and 2017²).

Retail is a developing industry that is both interesting and accommodating, irrespective of age or skill levels.

Retail jobs can be financially rewarding, offering training and skills development opportunities. The average wage of a retail sales assistant is £11-15k with that of a retail sales supervisor being in the region of £15-20k.

What is an Apprenticeship

An Apprenticeship is a mix of real work and learning. Apprentices earn a wage and get experience whilst working towards a number of qualifications. An Apprenticeship follows a Level 2 programme and can lead onto an Advanced Apprenticeship which is a Level 3 programme.

Example Job Roles as an Apprentice

Retail Assistant within;

- Clothing, Footwear and Electrical Stores
- Supermarkets
- Chemists
- Mail Order
- Salon

Apprenticeship Framework

There are a number of elements to each Apprenticeship and this is called the framework. Each Apprenticeship framework has three main strands:

- competence based element
- technical element
- skills element

The three strands are sometimes accompanied by additional qualifications to give the most relevant skills and knowledge required for the job.
